AFFIDAVIT OF STATE VENDOR UNDER CHAPTER 17-27 OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF RHODE ISLAND

Instructions:

Every person or business entity contracting with a state agency on or after July 27, 1993 to sell goods and services (contracting party) is deemed to be a "state vendor". Also deemed to be a "state vendor" is (a) a person having a 10% or greater ownership interest in such contracting party, or (b) a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party, or (c) a person who is the spouse or minor child of the contracting party, or of a person having such 10% or greater ownership interest, or of a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party (related parties).

This affidavit must be filed with the State Board of Elections, 50 Branch Avenue, Providence, Rhode Island 02904 by every state vendor in connection with any contract with a state agency to provide goods and/or services costing \$5000 or more. If the contract is in writing, this affidavit must be filed within 60 days after the contract is executed and MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A COPY OF THE CONTRACT, OR A WRITTEN SUMMARY THEREOF. If the contract is not in writing, then the affidavit must be filed within 60 days from the date when the state vendor is first notified that the \$5000 threshold has been reached. However, Chapter 17-27 and the Regulations adopted thereunder, permit semi-annual filings of affidavits under certain circumstances.

Every person or business entity qualifying as a state vendor (either as the contracting party or as a related party) and providing goods and services at a cost of \$5000 or more shall be responsible for filing this affidavit. A state vendor who is a contracting party must file this affidavit when the \$5000 threshold has been reached, even if no reportable political contributions have been made either by the contracting party or a related party. A state vendor who is a related party must file this affidavit only when a reportable political contribution has been made by such related party, and then, only if such contribution has not been included in an affidavit filed by the contracting party. A reportable political contribution is defined in question #16. The affidavit, when filed, will be a public document.

The Board of Elections is empowered to impose civil penalties for violations of Chapter 17-27.

The attention of state vendors is directed to the <u>Regulations</u> adopted by the Board of Elections in connection with the preparation and filing of this affidavit which are on file at the offices of both the Board of Elections and the Secretary of State.

NARRAGANSETT BAY COMMISSION AGREEMENT FOR LEGAL SERVICES CONTRACT NUMBER 2011C

This Agreement, is made this ______ day of July, 2010, by and between the Narragansett Bay Commission (hereinafter the "Commission") acting pursuant to the provisions of Title 46, Chapter 25 of the General Laws of Rhode Island and Partridge Snow & Hahn, LLP (hereinafter "PSH") and their successors and assigns.

The Commission and PHS in consideration of their mutual covenant herein and for other good and valuable consideration agree as follows:

1. SCOPE OF WORK

PSH, with Normand Benoit as Lead Counsel, may serve as bond counsel in connection with cash flow borrowing and the financing of Capital Projects, funded directly through proceeds from the issuance of long or short term revenue obligations at the Commission's request.

The Lead Counsel shall utilize and direct the resources of PSH including, but not limited to, attorneys, associate counsel and researchers to accomplish said legal functions at the discretion of the Executive Director or his/her designee in accordance with the Commission's By-Laws.

The parties shall maintain an attorney/client relationship throughout the term of this Agreement.

2. EXECUTION OF AGREEMENT AND MODIFICATIONS

This Agreement and any changes or modifications hereto shall be in writing and must be executed by both the Commission and PSH.

3. TERM

This Agreement and the terms herein shall be effective July 1, 2010 until June 30, 2011.

4. RESERVED

5. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES

From the date of July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011, the Commission shall compensate PSH for legal services at the rates specified below:

Hourly rate for Normand Benoit is \$375.00 Hourly rate for Eugene Bernardo, II is \$295.00 Hourly rate for other attorneys \$140.00 - \$375.00 Hourly rate for legal assistants \$90.00 - \$135.00 Partial Hours shall be billed on a pro rata basis

6. CHANGES/BUDGET ADJUSTMENT

The Commission may, at any time, by written order, make changes within the general scope of this Agreement, in the services or work to be performed. If such changes cause an increase or decrease in PSH's cost or time required to perform any services under this Agreement, whether or not changed by any order, the Commission and PSH shall make an equitable adjustment and modify this Agreement in writing.

PSH must assert any claim for adjustment under this clause within thirty (30) days from the date it receives the Commission's notification of change, unless the Commission grants additional time before the date of final payment. No claim by PSH for an equitable adjustment shall be allowed if made after final payment under this Agreement.

No services for which PSH will charge any additional compensation shall be furnished without the prior written approval of the Commission.

7. EXTENT OF AGREEMENT

Nothing herein shall be construed as creating any personal liability on the part of any officer or agent of any public body which may be a party hereto, nor shall it be construed as giving any rights or benefits hereunder to anyone other than the Commission and PSH.

8. SUB-CONTRACTS

PSH warrants that they will not sub-contract any portion of the tasks or sub-tasks they are obligated to perform under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the Commission.

the State of Rhode Island. If any part of this Agreement is found to be in conflict with applicable laws, such parts shall be inoperative, null and void, insofar as it is in conflict with said laws, but the remainder of the Agreement shall be in full force in effect.

I. Nature and Scope of Legal Representation.

A. Scope of Work and Communications. You have engaged us to provide legal counsel on matters of labor relations and employment, including advisory opinions, tax issues, litigation, and other legal services that may be required by the Department of Education. The scope of our representation, along with any limitations upon those services, shall be determined pursuant to discussions and correspondence with you throughout our association. Any expression on our part concerning the outcome of your legal matter is an expression of our professional judgment, but is not a guarantee. Such opinions are necessarily limited by our knowledge of the facts and are based on the state of the law at the time they are expressed.

The extent of work necessary to satisfactorily resolve your matter may vary significantly from our original expectations, and therefore, we will attempt to maintain open lines of communication to keep you apprised about the status of your matter. Furthermore, as a matter of course, we will send you copies of all pertinent correspondence, documents, and other materials prepared or received by us in the course of our representation. You are also encouraged to contact us whenever you have any questions or comments regarding the status of your matter, or whenever any new facts or developments come to your attention.

- B. Attorney Assignment. Customarily, each client has a principal attorney who will have supervisory responsibility for legal matters involving the client. The principal attorney assigned to your matter is David C. Morganelli. You are free to request a change of principal attorney at any time, for any reason. intention to withdraw. In the event of withdrawal, we will cooperate with your new attorney to provide a smooth transition.

II. Fee Arrangement.

A. <u>Fee Determination</u>. It is often impossible to determine the full nature and extent of the legal services which your matter may ultimately require, because, throughout our representation, the facts and circumstances as known to us pertaining to your matter may change. For this reason, we are generally unable to charge a fixed amount for our services. Rather, our fee is based upon the time actually expended by attorneys and legal assistants. Charges are made for time spent on items such as conference and telephone calls with you and other individuals involved in your legal affairs, legal research and analysis, court appearances, consultations with other attorneys, review of documentary materials, preparation and drafting of legal documents, correspondence and memoranda, and travel time.

Our hourly rates for our professionals vary depending upon the experience of the professionals and the nature and complexity of the matter or issues involved. David C. Morganelli's rate is \$290 per hour, and we certify that this rate does not exceed the rate of compensation charged by this firm for Mr. Morganelli's services to its preferred public or private clients.

We will keep accurate records of the time we devote to your work, and will provide you with detailed time records as a normal component of each invoice we render. The hourly rates of our lawyers and legal assistants are reviewed and adjusted annually to reflect current levels of legal experience, and other factors. Adjustments to our hourly rates normally occur in the summer, however, we will not adjust Mr. Morganelli's hourly rate without your prior consent.

- B. Expenses. We typically incur and pay on behalf of our clients a variety of costs in connection with our legal representation. Whenever such costs are incurred, we will carefully itemize and bill these charges. Interest earned on a segregated trust account will be added to the deposit for your benefit and will be included in your taxable income.

D. <u>Billing Arrangements</u>. We will bill you on a monthly basis for both fees and disbursements. You agree to make payment within thirty (30) days of our invoice date. If our invoices are not paid within thirty (30) days of the invoice date, we reserve the right to accrue and collect interest on the outstanding balance of your account at the rate of 1% per month (12% per annum).

We will give you prompt notice if your account becomes delinquent, and you agree to bring the account current upon request. If the delinquency continues and you do not arrange satisfactory payment terms, we may withdraw from your representation and pursue collection of your account. You agree to pay the costs of collecting the debt, including expenses and reasonable attorneys' fees.

E. <u>Your Right to Arbitrate</u>. If you disagree with the amount of our fee or are unhappy with any services rendered, please contact your principal attorney to discuss your concerns. Typically, such disagreements are resolved to the satisfaction of both sides with little inconvenience or formality. In the event of a fee dispute that is not readily resolved, you have the right to request arbitration under supervision of the State Bar Association, and we agree to participate fully in the process.

III. E-Verify

A. <u>E-Verify Compliance.</u> We certify that we have registered to utilize the E-Verify program (www.dhs.gov/E-Verify) to ensure compliance with federal and state law. We understand and agree that we are required to continue to utilize the services of the E-Verify program for as long as we continue to do business with the State of Rhode Island. We further understand that our failure to continue to utilize the services of the E-Verify program will adversely affect our ability to continue to do business with the State of Rhode Island and our ability to do business with the State of Rhode Island in the future.

AFFIDAVIT OF STATE VENDOR UNDER CHAPTER 17-27 OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF RHODE ISLAND

Instructions:

Every person or business entity contracting with a state agency on or after July 27, 1993 to sell goods and services (contracting party) is deemed to be a "state vendor". Also deemed to be a "state vendor" is (a) a person having a 10% or greater ownership interest in such contracting party, or (b) a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party, or (c) a person who is the spouse or minor child of the contracting party, or of a person having such 10% or greater ownership interest, or of a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party (related parties).

This affidavit must be filed with the State Board of Elections, 50 Branch Avenue, Providence, Rhode Island 02904 by every state vendor in connection with any contract with a state agency to provide goods and/or services costing \$5000 or more. If the contract is in writing, this affidavit must be filed within 60 days after the contract is executed and MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A COPY OF THE CONTRACT, OR A WRITTEN SUMMARY THEREOF. If the contract is not in writing, then the affidavit must be filed within 60 days from the date when the state vendor is first notified that the \$5000 threshold has been reached. However, Chapter 17-27 and the Regulations adopted thereunder, permit semi-annual filings of affidavits under certain circumstances.

Every person or business entity qualifying as a state vendor (either as the contracting party or as a related party) and providing goods and services at a cost of \$5000 or more shall be responsible for filing this affidavit. A state vendor who is a contracting party must file this affidavit when the \$5000 threshold has been reached, even if no reportable political contributions have been made either by the contracting party or a related party. A state vendor who is a related party must file this affidavit only when a reportable political contribution has been made by such related party, and then, only if such contribution has not been included in an affidavit filed by the contracting party. A reportable political contribution is defined in question #16. The affidavit, when filed, will be a public document.

The Board of Elections is empowered to impose civil penalties for violations of Chapter 17-27.

The attention of state vendors is directed to the <u>Regulations</u> adopted by the Board of Elections in connection with the preparation and filing of this affidavit which are on file at the offices of both the Board of Elections and the Secretary of State.

This letter shall serve to summarize our understanding with regard to the engagement of the law firm of PATRIDGE SNOW & HAHN LLP ("Counsel") for the provision of legal services to Rhode Island Housing and Mortgage Finance Corporation ("Rhode Island Housing").

The engagement will involve representation of Rhode Island Housing on an as requested basis with regard to Homeownership program loans held by Rhode Island Housing that have defaulted. The terms of the engagement will be for one year commencing December 1, 2009 and ending November 30, 2010. Rhode Island Housing may renew this agreement for an additional one year term subject to funding availability

Our agreement with respect to the engagement is as follows:

<u>Horeclosures</u>: Foreclosure representation shall include, but not be limited: representation of the Corporation in the foreclosure of defaulted mortgages held by Rhode Island Housing drafting of correspondence and notices as required by law or requested by Rhode Island Housing; co-ordination of advertisements and auctioneer services as required by law or requested by Rhode Island Housing; attendance at foreclosure sales; preparation of sales documents and deed; along with such other services as are necessary or desirable to accomplish the objectives of Rhode Island Housing.

Bankruptcy Representation: Bankruptcy representation shall include, but not be limited to: representation of Rhode Island Housing in the bankruptcy proceedings of mortgagors; attention to and completion of the following as necessary or advisable: 1) entry of appearance and filing of claims, 2) responses to notices, 3) attendance at debtor's §341 hearing, and 4) the filing of petitions for relief from stay; along with such other representation as may be necessary or advisable.

<u>Fees:</u> Fees charged by Counsel shall be in compliance with those set forth by Fannie Mae in Announcement 08-19, dated August 6, 2008, and attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> (as it may be amended from time to time).

Additionally the following fee schedule is provided for certain other services:

Evictions: \$500.00 Auctioneers Fee: \$150.00 Auctioneers Continuance Fee: \$100.00

Counsel hereby agrees that it will not charge a continuance fee if the continuation request is timely. Counsel's continuance fee \$100.00 (will be charged only when foreclosure notices have been mailed and advertisement (legal) has been placed.

In the event that representation in any particular matter results in an extraordinary expenditure of time, Counsel may, with the prior written consent of Rhode Island Housing, charge for additional work at the rate \$150.00 per hour for attorneys, and \$60 per hour for paralegals. Counsel represents that the rate of compensation charged to Rhode Island Housing does not exceed the rate of compensation charged by Counsel to its preferred public of private clients.

<u>Reimbursables</u>: Counsel shall invoice at cost for reimbursable costs, included, but not limited to: copying, fax, long distance telephone, auctioneer charges not paid for by third parties, advertisements and mailing charges incurred in the provision of legal services to Rhode Island Housing.

E-Verify: In accordance with Executive Order 08-01 (available at www.governor.ri.gov), Counsel certifies that is has registered and uses the federal E-Verify program established by the Department of Homeland Security in partnership with the Social Security Administration to verify and confirm that all new hires are authorized to work in the United States. Counsel agrees that it shall provide such documentation of its registration with and use of E-Verify as Rhode Island Housing may reasonably require.

Major State Decision Maker: Except as set forth in an attachment to this agreement, Counsel represents and warrants that no "Major State Decision-maker", as defined in R.I.G.L. Section 42.6.1, nor the spouse or dependent child of such person, holds (i) a ten percent or greater equity interest, or (ii) a Five Thousand Dollar or greater cash interest in the firm. Counsel agrees promptly to notify Rhode Island Housing in the event that a Major State Decision-maker, or the spouse of dependent child of such person, acquires an interest as set forth above, and to deliver a copy of the annual financial disclosure required to be filed with the Rhode Island Ethics Commission.

Other terms: This agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Rhode Island. This agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective administrators, legal representative, successors and assigns.

Once executed, this agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with respect to matters involving the engagement of Counsel, the payment of fees in connection therewith, and supersedes any prior understanding or oral agreements between the parties respecting the engagement and may only be modified by written agreement of the parties.

Every person or business entity contracting with a state agency on or after July 27, 1993 to sell goods and services (contracting party) is deemed to be a "state vendor". Also deemed to be a "state vendor" is (a) a person having a 10% or greater ownership interest in such contracting party, or (b) a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party, or (c) a person who is the spouse or minor child of the contracting party, or of a person having such 10% or greater ownership interest, or of a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party (related parties).

This affidavit must be filed with the State Board of Elections, 50 Branch Avenue, Providence, Rhode Island 02904 by every state vendor in connection with any contract with a state agency to provide goods and/or services costing \$5000 or more. Every person or business entity qualifying as a state vendor (either as the contracting party or as a related party) and providing goods and services at a cost of \$5000 or more shall be responsible for filing this affidavit. A state vendor who is a contracting party must file this affidavit when the \$5000 threshold has been reached, even if no reportable political contributions have been made either by the contracting party or a related party. Pursuant to an affirmative vote of the Rhode Island Public Finance Management Board at its August 10, 2005 meeting, this letter will confirm the engagement of Partridge Snow & Hahn LLP (the "Firm") to provide legal services to the Rhode Island Public Finance Management Board (the "Board"). AFFIDAVIT OF STATE VENDOR UNDER CHAPTER 17-27 OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF RHODE ISLAND

Instructions:

Every person or business entity contracting with a state agency on or after July 27, 1993 to sell goods and services (contracting party) is deemed to be a "state vendor". Also deemed to be a "state vendor" is (a) a person having a 10% or greater ownership interest in such contracting party, or (b) a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party, or (c) a person who is the spouse or minor child of the contracting party, or of a person having such 10% or greater ownership interest, or of a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party (related parties).

This affidavit must be filed with the State Board of Elections, 50 Branch Avenue, Providence, Rhode Island 02904 by every state vendor in connection with any contract with a state agency to provide goods and/or services costing \$5000 or more. If the contract is in writing, this affidavit must be filed within 60 days after the contract is executed and MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A COPY OF THE CONTRACT, OR A WRITTEN SUMMARY THEREOF. If the contract is not in writing, then the affidavit must be filed within 60 days from the date when the state vendor is first notified that the \$5000 threshold has been reached. However, Chapter 17-27 and the Regulations adopted thereunder, permit semi-annual filings of affidavits under certain circumstances.

Every person or business entity qualifying as a state vendor (either as the contracting party or as a related party) and providing goods and services at a cost of \$5000 or more shall be responsible for filing this affidavit. A state vendor who is a contracting party must file this affidavit when the \$5000 threshold has been reached, even if no reportable political contributions have been made either by the contracting party or a related party. A state vendor who is a related party must file this affidavit only when a reportable political contribution has been made by such related party, and then, only if such contribution has not been included in an affidavit filed by the contracting party. A reportable political contribution is defined in question #16. The affidavit, when filed, will be a public document.

The Board of Elections is empowered to impose civil penalties for violations of Chapter 17-27.

The attention of state vendors is directed to the <u>Regulations</u> adopted by the Board of Elections in connection with the preparation and filing of this affidavit which are on file at the offices of both the Board of Elections and the Secretary of State.

However, on those bond issues in which it is not Bond Counsel, the Firm may serve as counsel for any other party who requests the Firm's representation, provided there is not a conflict with the State's interests.

Fees shall include all out-of-pocket expenses associated with this engagement except preparation of closing binders.

General Advice

AFFIDAVIT OF STATE VENDOR UNDER CHAPTER 17-27 OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF RHODE ISLAND

Instructions:

Every person or business entity contracting with a state agency on or after July 27, 1993 to sell goods and services (contracting party) is deemed to be a "state vendor". Also deemed to be a "state vendor" is (a) a person having a 10% or greater ownership interest in such contracting party, or (b) a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party, or (c) a person who is the spouse or minor child of the contracting party, or of a person having such 10% or greater ownership interest, or of a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party (related parties).

This affidavit must be filed with the State Board of Elections, 50 Branch Avenue, Providence, Rhode Island 02904 by every state vendor in connection with any contract with a state agency to provide goods and/or services costing \$5000 or more. If the contract is in writing, this affidavit must be filed within 60 days after the contract is executed and MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A COPY OF THE CONTRACT, OR A WRITTEN SUMMARY THEREOF. If the contract is not in writing, then the affidavit must be filed within 60 days from the date when the state vendor is first notified that the \$5000 threshold has been reached. Every person or business entity qualifying as a state vendor (either as the contracting party or as a related party) and providing goods and services at a cost of \$5000 or more shall be responsible for filing this affidavit. If the contract is in writing, this affidavit must be filed within 60 days after the contract is executed and MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A COPY OF THE CONTRACT, OR A WRITTEN SUMMARY THEREOF. If the contract is not in writing, then the affidavit must be filed within 60 days from the date when the state vendor is first notified that the \$5000 threshold has been reached. However, Chapter 17-27 and the Regulations adopted thereunder, permit semi-annual filings of affidavits under certain circumstances.

Every person or business entity qualifying as a state vendor (either as the contracting party or as a related party) and providing goods and services at a cost of \$5000 or more shall be responsible for filing this affidavit. A state vendor who is a contracting party must file this affidavit when the \$5000 threshold has been reached, even if no reportable political contributions have been made either by the contracting party or a related party. A state vendor who is a related party must file this affidavit only when a reportable political contribution has been made by such related party, and then, only if such contribution has not been included in an affidavit filed by the contracting party. A reportable political contribution is defined in question #16. The affidavit, when filed, will be a public document.

The Board of Elections is empowered to impose civil penalties for violations of Chapter 17-27.

The attention of state vendors is directed to the <u>Regulations</u> adopted by the Board of Elections in connection with the preparation and filing of this affidavit which are on file at the offices of both the Board of Elections and the Secretary of State.

Conflict of Interest

AFFIDAVIT OF STATE VENDOR UNDER CHAPTER 17-27 OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF RHODE ISLAND

Instructions:

Every person or business entity contracting with a state agency on or after July 27, 1993 to sell goods and services (contracting party) is deemed to be a "state vendor". Also deemed to be a "state vendor" is (a) a person having a 10% or greater ownership interest in such contracting party, or (b) a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party, or (c) a person who is the spouse or minor child of the contracting party, or of a person having such 10% or greater ownership interest, or of a person who is an executive officer of such contracting party (related parties).

This affidavit must be filed with the State Board of Elections, 50 Branch Avenue, Providence, Rhode Island 02904 by every state vendor in connection with any contract with a state agency to provide goods and/or services costing \$5000 or more. If the contract is in writing, this affidavit must be filed within 60 days after the contract is executed and MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A COPY OF THE CONTRACT, OR A WRITTEN SUMMARY THEREOF. If the contract is not in writing, then the affidavit must be filed within 60 days from the date when the state vendor is first notified that the \$5000 threshold has been reached. However, Chapter 17-27 and the Regulations adopted thereunder, permit semi-annual filings of affidavits under certain circumstances.

Every person or business entity qualifying as a state vendor (either as the contracting party or as a related party) and providing goods and services at a cost of \$5000 or more shall be responsible for filing this affidavit. A state vendor who is a contracting party must file this affidavit when the \$5000 threshold has been reached, even if no reportable political contributions have been made either by the contracting party or a related party. A state vendor who is a related party must file this affidavit only when a reportable political contribution has been made by such related party, and then, only if such contribution has not been included in an affidavit filed by the contracting party. A reportable political contribution is defined in question #16. The affidavit, when filed, will be a public document.

The Board of Elections is empowered to impose civil penalties for violations of Chapter 17-27.

The attention of state vendors is directed to the <u>Regulations</u> adopted by the Board of Elections in connection with the preparation and filing of this affidavit which are on file at the offices of both the Board of Elections and the Secretary of State.

PARTRIDGE SNOW & HAHN LLP STANDARD CONDITIONS REGARDING LEGAL REPRESENTATION AND FEE ARRANGEMENT

I. Nature and Scope of Legal Representation.

A. Scope of Work and Communications. You have engaged us to provide legal services relating to various legal matters that may arise from time to time. The scope of our representation, along with any limitations upon those services, shall be determined pursuant to discussions and correspondence with you throughout our association. Any expression on our part concerning the outcome of your legal matter is an expression of our professional judgment, but is not a guarantee. Such opinions are necessarily limited by our knowledge of the facts and are based on the state of the law at the time they are expressed.

The extent of work necessary to satisfactorily resolve your matter may vary significantly from our original expectations, and therefore, we will attempt to maintain open lines of communication to keep you apprised about the status of your matter.
